

The 2008 ARNOVA Award for Distinguished Achievement and Leadership in Nonprofit and Voluntary Action Research

This award is given annually for significant contributions to the field through research and leadership.

Award Criteria:

- Nominee must have made significant and sustained achievement(s) in the field of nonprofit and voluntary action research and/or significant leadership achievements in the advancement and promotion of such research over an extended period of time.
- In addition to significant contributions to research, a nominee's contribution to leadership may be considered. For example, leadership in advancing the field—in such forms as program development and direction and teaching—that helps to institutionalize the research and study of the nonprofit sector and volunteerism—is relevant to gauging a person's overall contribution to the field.
- The nominee need not be a member of ARNOVA.

The Award Recipient Receives:

The award recipient will receive a check in the amount of \$1,000 and a commemorative clock. The awardee is expected to receive the award in person during the ARNOVA Annual Conference in Philadelphia, Pa., November 20-22, 2008.

To Nominate Someone:

- Submit a letter of nomination (a maximum of two pages), the nominee's curriculum vitae, and the nomination form on the facing page.
- A second nomination also is required for the award. The second nominator also should submit a letter of nomination (a maximum of two pages). Either the nominator or the second nominator should come from a different institutional base rather than that of the nominee, and at least one should be a member of ARNOVA.
- Self-nominations are not considered.
